



LOCAL AND NATIONAL ADVOCACY

In India over 30,000 community-based organisation leaders have been trained in Citizen Voice and Action (CVA) and 869 functional CVA groups have been formed, holding government to account for quality health, education and child protection services.



In Tanzania, more than 60,000 most vulnerable girls and boys were affected through the direct support of locally formed savings groups. The groups allocated 10% of their income to care for the most vulnerable children in their communities through the provision of scholastic materials, school fees, shelter, and food.



TRANSFORMED RELATIONSHIPS

Children are being empowered to raise important issues with key decision makers. For example in Malawi, child journalists are trained to document, analyse and share issues with local authorities. This is improving the children's confidence (as seen in monitoring results) and changing the way local leaders view children.

HOUSEHOLD AND FAMILY RESILIENCE

The Village Savings and Loan
Associations supported by
WV Rwanda are assisting
57,000 farmers and their families. Members report improved
self-confidence, self-reliance
and social status. Women say
they are no longer dependent
on their husbands but are able
to supplement family income.
Evaluations show the increased
income has been used to improve nutrition and educational
resources for their children.



PARTNERING

WV Ghana is working with local government and civil society partners in 2 ADPs to assure household food security; they are strengthening sustainability through capability building of the partners and then implementing together, with joint monitoring of the projects.



LOCAL OWNERSHIP

Increased community participation in planning, and capacity building of water management committees, when combined with advocacy on water provision, has resulted in wider and more sustainable provision of safe water. Water management committees in Bangladesh plan and solve problems together and raise money to pay for ongoing maintenance.
